Overview of the Inuka Enterprise Development Program:

The banking industry umbrella body, Kenya Bankers Association (KBA) is sponsoring a capacity building program, targeting micro, small and medium-sized enterprises (MSMEs). The program has objectives under five (5) broad themes, namely:

- 1. Moving businesses and entrepreneurs from Informal to Formal Businesses.
- 2. Promoting Job Creation through enterprise development
- 3. Enhancing Access to Finance / Capital
- 4. Promoting Value Addition towards enhancing local, regional and international competitiveness

Scope of the Assignment

- 1. Still images of the Nairobi Skyline with prominently known buildings featured
- 2. Still images of a subject in a tea plantation e.g in Limuru
- 3. Still images of a subject in the textile industry
- 4. Still images of a bustling market e.g Kangemi or City Market

5. Still images of subjects in a construction site

Deliverables

The successful vendor will be expected to:

- 1. Provide captivating and descriptive photos of the various aforementioned locations.
- 2. Ensure that permission has been granted to the vendor by the subject or owner of the locations the images are to be taken.
- 3. Provide raw images from which selections can be made for the purpose of editing.
- 4. Provide 20 edited images without a watermark which are clearly labelled with captions.
- 5. Images should be shared through a designated hard drive or a flash drive.
- 6. All photographs must have an absolute minimum of 100dpi but should be 300dpi or higher.

Closing time and date for all submitted proposals will be Noon (12:00 PM), **4th October 2017**. Include your previous work done that showcases your professional experience. Also submit your quotation for carrying out this task.
